

ASSOCIATE IN SCIENCE DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

The Associate in Science (AS) transfer degree is designed to provide the first two years of a typical college or university bachelor's degree program in liberal arts, general education, or pre-professional studies. By earning the degree, you'll have met the general requirements at several area colleges and universities. Work with your advisor for recommended courses within each requirement based on your area of interest. To earn the Associate in Science degree, complete the following: Earn a minimum of 64 semester credits, including three credits designated to fulfill the diversity requirement. Maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or higher. Complete general requirements totaling 40 or more semester credits.
